The hull is made of white gelcoat but has been wrapped with an elegant dark grey satin film that preserves its integrity as well as giving it a more attractive appearance.

Configured in the exclusive two-cabin version, in addition to the usual and very generous owner's cabin with en suite bathroom in the bow, we find the second cabin (in fact a second owner's cabin) and the large bathroom with separate shower room at the stern. In the cockpit, on the other hand, there is a large locker where you can comfortably stow everything you need for your cruise.

Easy to sail on, thanks to the manoeuvres sent back to the two primary winches at the stern (one electric) and manoeuvring thanks to the bow thruster.

On this example of the prestigious Italian shipyard, the B&G electronic instrumentation and a complete set of sails stand out.

In short, a great opportunity for those looking for an elegant and exclusive cruiser-racer.
